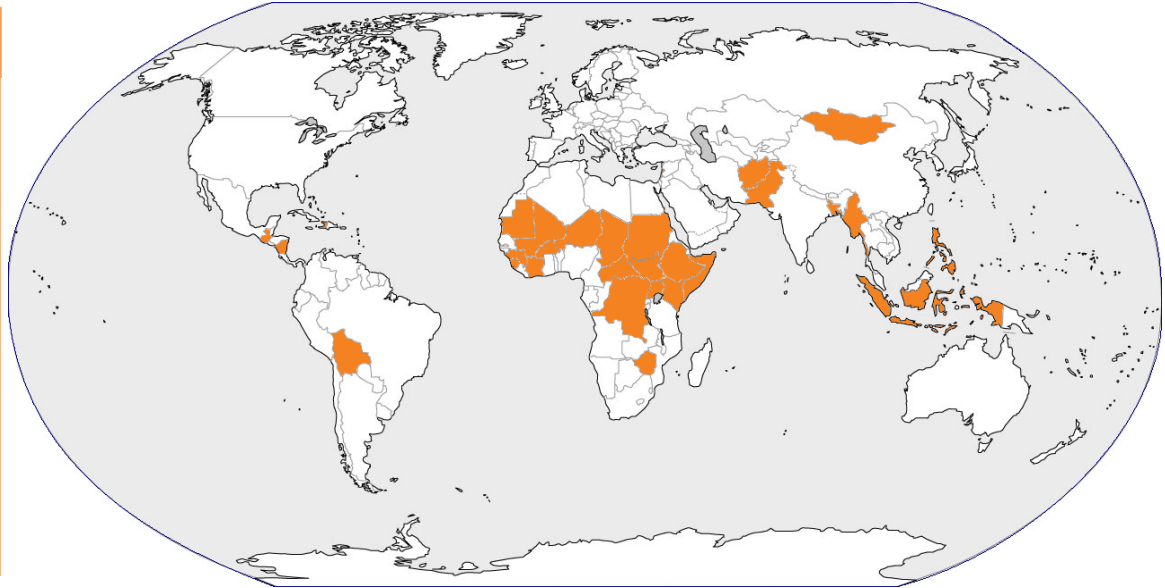

## OVERVIEW

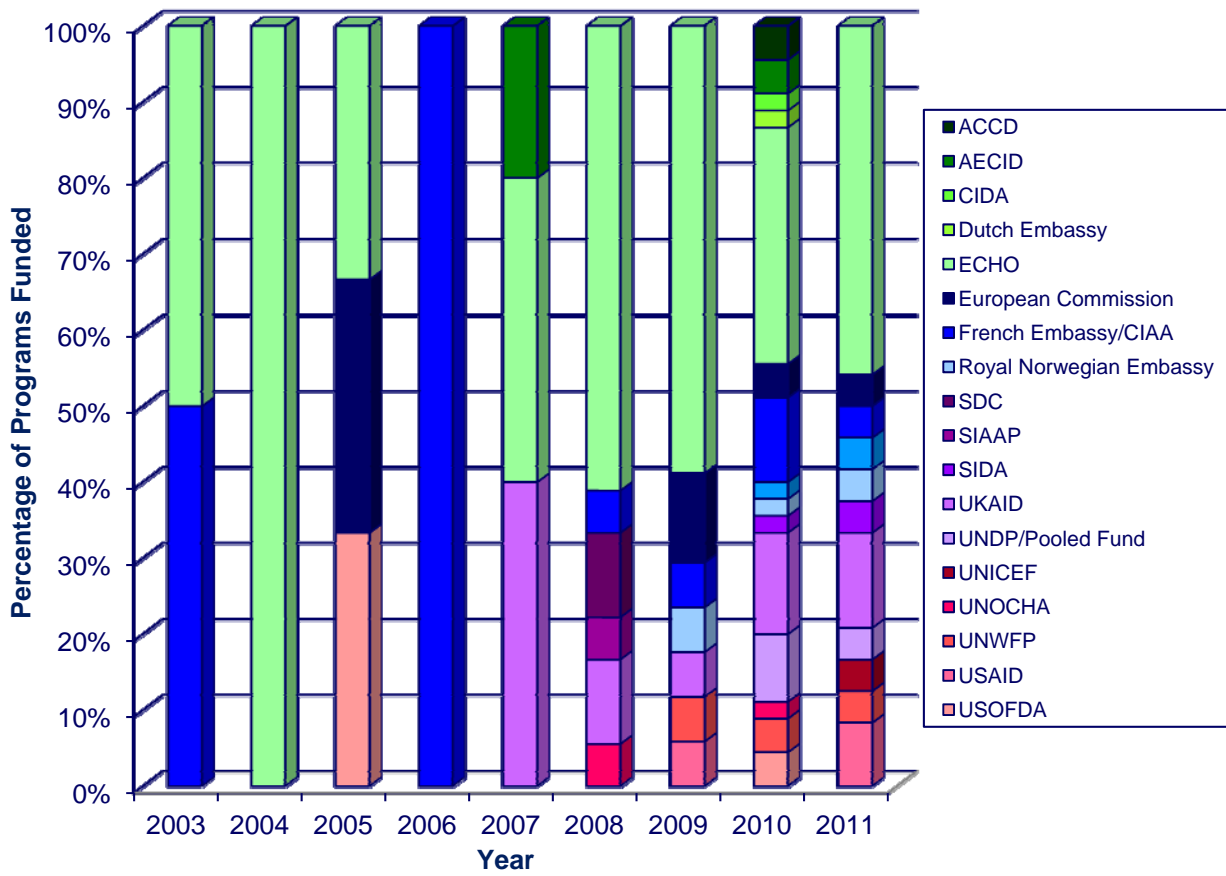
In the last eight years, ACF has implemented 113 cash based interventions (CBIs) and responded to the needs of over 450,000 households in 29 countries. ACF used cash as a response tool to both rapid- and slow-onset emergencies.



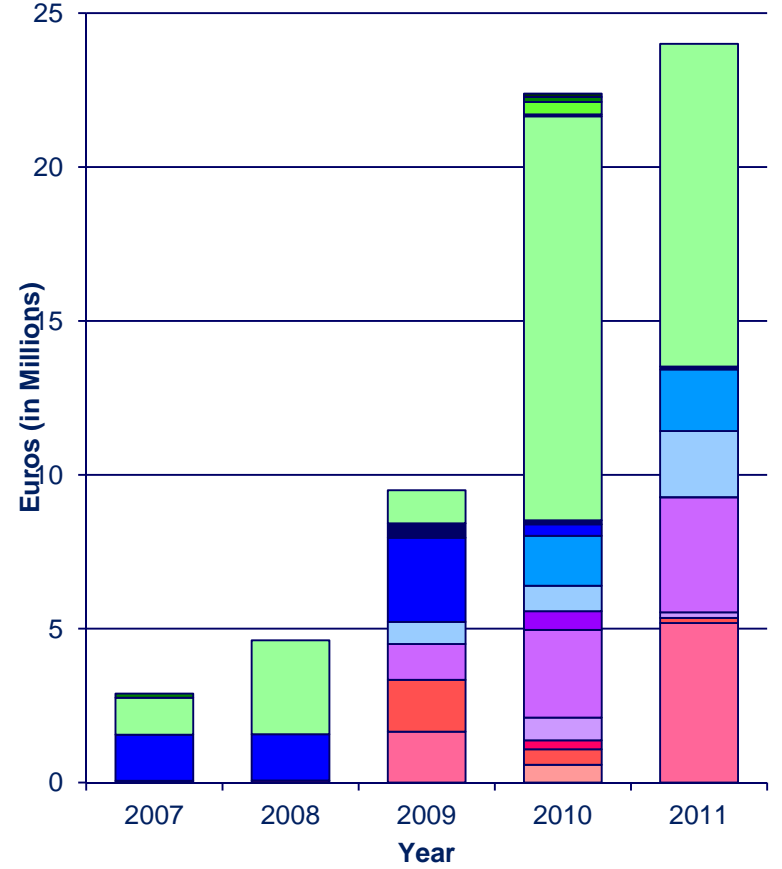
## FUNDING

ACF has received over €63.4 million in funding for CBIs in the last five years. ECHO has provided the most support (over 45% of our total CBI funding in the last five years), followed by DFID (12.32%), USAID (10.78%), and CIAA (9.63%).

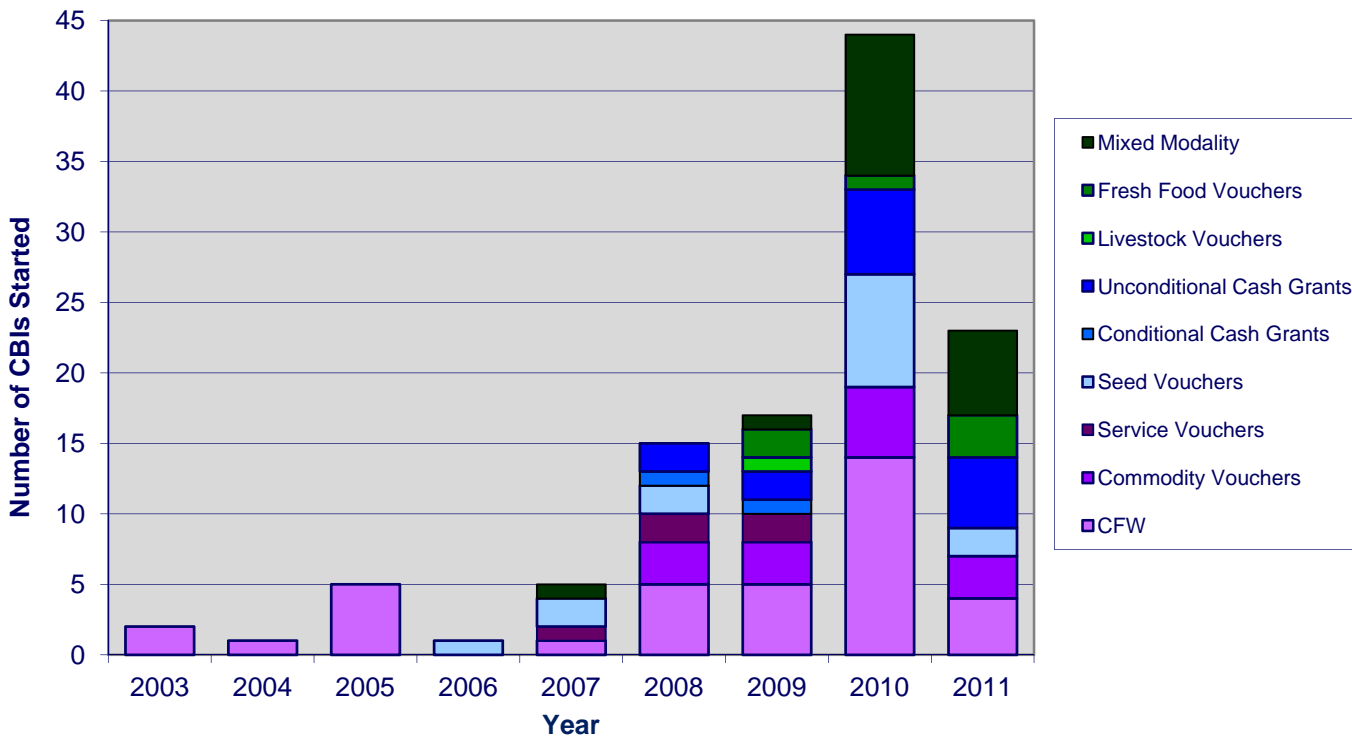
### Diversity of CBI Funding

## TRANSFER MECHANISMS

The growing tendency to implement a program with multiple mechanisms is a result of the increased understanding of the strengths, weaknesses, and appropriateness of each transfer option. Reliance on cash for work (CFW) programs, which are widely accepted and can provide a valuable service to the affected community, has faded. Interest in and willingness to use **direct cash grants** is growing. The development of new transfer technologies suitable for humanitarian responses has helped ACF make transfers more efficient.
